The Money Bird by Sheila Webster Boneham

Some refer to this type of book as guilty reading, some as fluff. I prefer to use the term pleasure reading which is certainly needed after one watches the nightly news. The Money Bird, according to the author, is the last bird the dog retrieves in a retriever field trial; without this bird, the dog and handler win no money. Along the way to solving a murder which takes place at the retriever club training grounds, you will enjoy the antics of a Labrador Retriever, an Australian Shepherd, a cat named Leo and some exotic parrots. There are practice sessions at the obedience club training facility and the author who has both Labrador Retrievers and Australian Shepherds knows her material. She has written several non-fiction books including *Training Your Dog for Life, Rescue Matters* and breed specific books for the Brittany, the Shetland Sheepdog, the Boxer, and several others. Her first fiction book was Drop Dead on Recall, a book on my to be read list.

On Talking Terms with Dogs: Calming Signals by Turid Rugaas

Praised by some of the top experts in dog behavior and training, this small 74 page book helps us to identify and resolve stressful situations for our dogs and avoid conflict with not only other dogs, but also with humans. It teaches how to observe our dogs for signs of stress which sometimes are quite subtle including sniffing, nose licking, head turning and curving. Rugaas is considered the foremost authority on calming signals. She includes case histories and also how to use calming signals in practical handling and training as well as how to help the dog that has lost this language, perhaps due to punishment when using the signals. Calming Signals is a must read for anyone who strives for better communication with dogs.


